### The facts about Medicaid in Rep. Obernolte's district:

**Medicaid provides essential health care to 408,320 people in Rep. Jay Obernolte's district.**

Any cuts to Medicaid would severely impact:

- **371,162 individuals relying on Medi-Cal health insurance**, including people with disabilities, children, and seniors
- **9,497 individuals with developmental disabilities** supported by regional centers
- **10,500 people receiving In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS)** to remain in their homes
- **2,790 foster youth** relying on crucial services
- **173,419 people receiving food assistance** through Cal-Fresh
- **21,070 individuals covered** through Covered California

### Drastic Medicaid cuts would devastate Obernolte's disabled constituents

Cuts to Medicaid would force thousands of disabled people out of their homes and into institutions, limit access to essential services, and strain local resources. Drastic reductions would:

- **Slash IHSS funding**, leaving thousands of seniors and disabled individuals without caregivers, increasing hospitalizations and nursing home placements
- **Cut funding for regional center services**, reducing essential supports for individuals with developmental disabilities
- **Threaten Medi-Cal coverage**, pushing disabled people, families, and children into medical debt or forcing them to forgo care

### Medicaid supports independent living and employment for people with disabilities

Medicaid ensures that people with disabilities can live in their homes and participate in their communities. It covers:

- Doctor visits, prescriptions, mobility aids, hearing aids, treatments, surgeries, and transportation
- Personal care attendants and direct care workers assisting with daily tasks like eating, dressing, and working
- Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS), helping people with disabilities get jobs, and preventing unnecessary institutionalization and costly hospitalizations
